owners stop by and drop off food, clothing and help in many different ways. Most importantly, they share their hearts with our kids.



Dear ICC Family,

The ministry of ICC was developed specifically for children such as these who have lost one or both parents and who have no other relatives or friends willing or able to care for them. And even though their lives started with tragedy, through the providence of God and the ministry of ICC, these young people have been able to rise above adversity and have finished high school.

I'd like to share a personal testimony from one of the boys...

My name is Satish Chekka, a very grateful child of Sweet Home, India. I joined this home when I was just eight years of age. I grew up alongside seventy-five brothers and sisters and have been having an enjoyable experience.
