Eliel grew up at the Los Pinos children's village in Guatemala. He had to leave his country to follow his dream of becoming a pastor. For several years Eliel studied Theology at Linda Vista University in Mexico where he recently earned his degree. Pastors are in high demand now in Guatemala, and the Adventist Mission is anxiously waiting for him to return to the country. They have assigned him to a pastoral position near the city of Queseltenango. They wanted him to start the first of July, but before he can go he must finish a seminar that is required by the Mexican government. He is expecting to be back in Guatemala by September 1.

> This past May, Sharon and Timothy, two of our young people from India, graduated with Theology degrees from Spicer College. Sharon is our first young lady to complete a degree in this field of study. She is well-respected. With the assistance of a sponsor, she plans to pursue a master's degree.

One day, Mr. Raj, a kind teacher from the school adjacent to the DEWS Sweet Home Children's Village was passing through the train station. He noticed Timothy, and after finding out his name Mr. Raj inquired, "What are you doing here in the station all by yourself?"

Timothy replied, "I stay here. I have nowhere else to go. I work cleaning the trains, and people sometimes give me some money. I sometimes find food to eat that people have left."

Timothy didn't know the names of his parents, his family name or the name of his village. The train station had become his home, and he had lived this life longer than he could remember.

Mr. Raj asked Timothy if he would like to live in a real home. Timothy nodded yes enthusiastically. Mr. Raj took Timothy to the DEWS Sweet Home that your donations help to support. Lilly Kaligithi, the director, welcomed Timothy into the Sweet Home family and mothered him as her own child.

Over the years, Timothy grew into a fine young man under the watchful care of Lilly and the staff at the children's village. He thrived in his home life and school life and was chosen as president of his high school graduating class. And now, four years later, he once again has passed another milestone earning his degree in Theology. Like Sharon, with the help of a sponsor, he also plans to study towards a master's degree.

Let me underscore this, your investment in these kids make stories like this possible. You may not be able to do the "mothering" or "fathering" that our skilled program staff does each day. However, your prayer and financial support are critical success factors for the children.

As these young people continue their education or begin their pastoral careers, many of their "brothers and sisters" are following in their footsteps – eager to learn, eager to prepare themselves to lead productive lives. Many of you have given sacrificially for many years to help these orphan children. They are grateful for their sponsors and donors who make it possible for them to follow their dreams.

The Congo Container arrives safely!

e've received our first few photos from ICC Congo showing the arrival and unloading of the container. Désiré Murhima, the ICC-Congo project administrator, sent these photos so you could see that the container had made it to its destination. Désiré also sent his thanks to all of you for your kind generosity to the children of Patmos.

Here are some exerpts from Désiré's letter:

"Friday, 20 June, 2014 was an extraordinary and memorable day different from other days because the grace and power of God have been exhibited. That day, the container spent the night inside the fence of ICC-PROLASA offices. On Sunday morning, the container was taken to the offices of



ICC-Congo. Both the staff of ICC-PROLASA, as well as our children from Goma, had been told one week before about the unloading of the container.

"Everybody partook in the task of unloading the container with commitment and joy because the container has been awaited

for many months. Since we did not have enough space to store the contents of the container, we rented three vehicles... to get the goods down the harbor.

"In the name of Patmos Children's Village, I present my sincere thanks and gratefulness of the charity manifested by the American donors towards us. May God provide you with abundant richness, good health, peace of mind and the Kingdom."
